A TRIBUTE TO DADS

Dear brothers and sisters,

Happy Father's day to all our amazing "Dads."

Today the Church celebrates the "Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. With the Pentecost Sunday the Season of Easter comes to an end and we begin the Ordinary Season yet we continue to celebrate two more solemnities: The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity and the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. Although the Easter Season is over and Ordinary Time has begun, this Sunday's celebration is not quite in the normal mold of Ordinary time. On this solemn day we reflect on God's love for us and how much God desires to make Himself known to us. As a result, He revealed the mystery of the Trinity to us. Although we can never completely understand the Holy Trinity which is the mystery of our faith, we can gain some insight into the Trinity as a model of unity and love. We as a community of faithful disciples of Jesus and temples of the Holy Spirit ought to reflect that love in our families and in our community.

Today is a very significant day for us all as we thank God for the gift of our Dads. Each of us will have so many wonderful memories as kids, teens and adults when Dad played such a meaningful role in our lives, was funny, and how he still continues to inspire us, whether around us, far away from us or gone before us. Dad knew his priorities were to love his family and to love his faith. He was a man who loved and served his family and his church. A significant body of scientific research clearly documents the vital role a father plays in the formative years of a child's life. Children need more than ever the presence and guidance of fathers in family life. The presence of a father has a positive impact in many ways, they note, as children with fathers have fewer behavioral problems, obtain better academic results, and are economically better off. As a Catholic Dad, our fathers have a much greater role to play in sharing his faith and shaping the future of each family, a domestic church, by living a virtuous life.

Blessed John Paul II took St. Joseph as a great model of a true fatherhood. Let us pray that each of our Dads will follow the example of a dedicated and loving father St. Joseph. May God bless our fathers with good health, peace and a happy life every day. May God grant eternal peace and joy to our fathers who have returned to God.

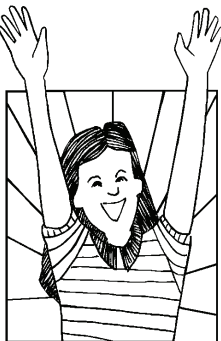

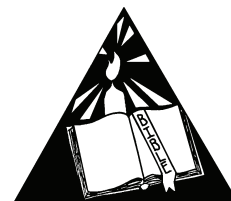

Capital Campaign Corner

We are persevering on behalf of the capital campaign. We are all in different stages of our life's journey. Some can give much, and some can give not as much as others, but all may pledge something. Step out in faith and be the faithful steward – pledge to the capital campaign. God will not be outdone in His generosity back to us.

THE QUESTION BOX



Q. We are being asked to make sizeable donations and pledge over a five year period. I don't dispute that we need to fund the education of seminarians, the priests' retirement, and faith formation. Is there an alternate R. solution?

- A. The problem of funding these urgent priorities was discussed at length with a wide group of pastors, parishioners, and staff at the Pastoral Center. This capital campaign represents the best approach possible. The Archbishop is very sensitive to the concerns that have been
- B. expressed throughout the Archdiocese, and gently reminds everyone that there is never a 'good' time to embark on a capital campaign.
- C. However it turns out, we know that God is in the mix, and many blessings will come of the generosity of those who do participate to the best of their abilities.

Q. Do I have to give the same amount each year? Would it be okay if I give the majority of my gift this year, then a small amount in out years?

- A. You can structure your donation in any way you wish. If you want to only make a commitment for three years you can do that too. Making a multi-year commitment to the capital campaign usually means people can give more than if they just give one time, and the Archdiocese can then count on long-term funding for these important priorities.

FREE BEGINNING GARDENING CLASSES

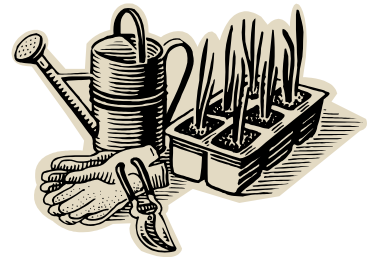

Living Your Strengths and Growing Spiritually

Do you know what specific gifts you have been given by God? Discover your God-given gifts (also known as *signature themes*) in the book, **Living Your Strengths**, available at no cost through the parish office. In the first letter of Peter, Chapter 4, he says:

“Each of you has been blessed with one of God’s many wonderful gifts to be used in the service of others. So use your gift well. If you have the gift of speaking, preach God’s message. If you have the gift of helping others, do it with the strength that God supplies. Everything should be done in a way that will bring honor to God because of Jesus Christ, who is glorious and powerful forever.”

This week we look at the gift of the Strategic theme. If you are strong in this gift, you have a distinctive way of thinking that allows you to see patterns where others see only complexity. You can see alternative routes and figure out what would happen so you can evaluate potential obstacles. As LYS says, this enables you “to carefully consider the whole picture and then generate the most effective set of actions or routes to take.” Scripture that relates to strategic comes from Proverbs 19:2:

“Without knowledge even zeal is not good; and he who acts hastily, blunders.”

Do you recognize yourself? As a Strategic thinker, it is important to allow yourself time to reflect on an issue or project until it becomes clear what path to take. One way to grow spiritually is to study the Bible and stories of the saints to understand how they responded to life’s challenges. Then you can apply that understanding to your similar life challenges to find the best ways to deal with them. If you also have the gifts of Developer or Individualization, LYS suggests you may want to consider becoming a sponsor for someone going through RCIA. These talents together make you an exceptional coach or mentor.
