THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST

Dear brothers and sisters,

Hurray! It's summer!

Wishing you and your family members a very happy feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. The Scripture readings on this solemnity call us to consider the meaning of the Holy Eucharist in the life of the Church and in our own personal lives. St. John's Gospel calls us to ponder the reality of Christ's presence in the Eucharist while 1 Corinthians calls us to consider the unity that it both symbolizes and brings about. The first reading looks at the Old Testament type for the Holy Eucharist, manna. Each of us must consider his/her own relationship to Jesus in the Holy Eucharist. With what faith do we approach our Eucharistic Lord and to what extent are we truly aware of the presence of Our Lord as we receive Him.

The liturgical sourcebook gives a wonderful explanation of the solemnity we celebrate today so I thought of sharing this article with you.

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ originated with a nun, Saint Juliana, prioress of a convent in thirteenth-century Belgium. She had a vision of the moon, full and bright, but with one part in shadow. The meaning of the vision was then revealed to her: the moon represented the liturgical year, the shadow a missing feast in honor of the Blessed Sacrament. Within thirty-five years, Pope Urban IV had established the feast of Corpus Christi, in the Church's universal calendar.

The 1969 reform of the calendar combined this medieval feast with the formerly and oddly separate feast of the Blood of Christ into a single celebration, calling it the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. This change is significant. The emphasis is not only on devotion for the Blessed Sacrament with the Eucharistic processions, but also on the celebration of the Eucharist.

The principal celebration of the Blessed Sacrament is of course the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday. Like today's solemnity, Holy Thursday includes a procession with the Blessed Sacrament. But the purpose and the mood of the two processions are strikingly different. On Holy Thursday, we walk with Jesus to the mount of Olives, to keep watch with him on the night of his betrayal. The sacrament is carried in the ciborium, covered with the humeral veil; and Christ's glory, too, is veiled as he undergoes his Passion. On the solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, we walk in the afterglow of the Easter season, in company with the risen Lord. This time, the Blessed Sacrament is exposed in a monstrance: The Lord's glory is not hidden, but visible to all.

Today's solemnity is an expression of our faith in the real presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament. And yet, this celebration is also outward-looking, carrying the liturgy out of the church and into the streets. We come together in all our diversity and celebrate our unity. (From the Liturgy Training Publications Source Book 2011).

On this Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ, it is only fitting to mention that we have a twenty-four hour, seven days a week Adoration Chapel in our parish. It is a quiet place of prayer before the Blessed Sacrament and you can either sign up for an hour a week or come say hello to Jesus and spend time with him any time of the day. 







Capital Campaign Corner

The gifts God has given us are likewise given for the good of others.

How am I using my gifts?

With what has been entrusted to you, please prayerfully consider what God may be calling you to do on behalf of this capital campaign effort. If all would participate, at whatever their capability, then we will be enormously successful in providing for our seminarians, our retired priests, Catholic education and Faith formation and for our parish. The all-parishioner, all-parish capital effort provides all a chance to give over the five year pledging period.

QUESTION BOX

Q. Where does the money for managing the Foundation funds come from? Will it decrease our 25%? Another way to ask it, are the gross receipts (coming to SJB) reduced by the cost of managing the Foundation funds over the next five years?



A. In lieu of hiring its own set of staff the Foundation corporation has contracted with the Archdiocese to manage the financial reporting and gift management on its behalf. For that service the bylaws for the corporation allow for up to \$15,000 per quarter for management fees for the Archdiocese. The fees will cover all accounting, investment, and annual audit costs as well as pledge redemption and receipting. This fee will be paid out of collected funds from the campaign. The Archdiocese feels this is a fair agreement and that the costs will be minimal in comparison to the work involved. The goal was not to make money on the transaction, but to ensure proper procedures are followed to keep the corporation's 501c3 status in good standing.

The Archdiocese is issuing the local parish's 25% based on gross collected, no fees deducted. The only thing that would affect the 25% is if a donor specifically restricted a gift.

FREE BEGINNING GARDENING CLASSES

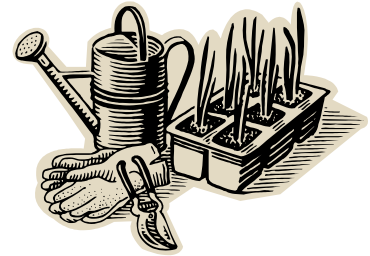

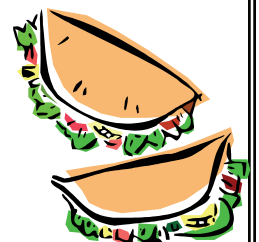

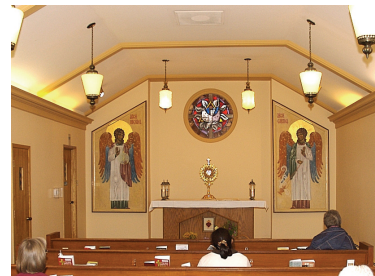

“Each of you has been blessed with one of God’s many wonderful gifts to be used in the service of others. So use your gift well. If you have the gift of speaking preach God’s message. If you have the gift of helping others, do it with the strength that God supplies. Everything should be done in a way that will bring honor to God because of Jesus Christ, who is glorious and powerful forever.”

This week we look at the gift of **Winning Others Over** (WOO). If you are strong in this gift, you enjoy meeting people and getting to know them, as well as getting them to like you. You are rarely at a loss for words, and find making connections invigorating and rewarding. Scripture that relates to WOO comes from Hebrews 13:2: “Do not neglect hospitality, for through it some have unknowingly entertained angels.”

Do you recognize yourself? Your WOO talents help people feel welcome and appreciated. One way to grow spiritually, according to LYS, is to “ask others thought-provoking questions, such as “What is the most meaningful religious experience you’ve had?” and engage in uplifting conversations that will help you feel connected to God in daily life.” You could also be a greeter at church, learning the names of as many parishioners as you can and introducing them to others who might have similar interests.
